

### Trail Rules:

- **Motorized vehicles are prohibited** – this is meant to be a safe place for all ages to walk/run/cycle, without being concerned with vehicular traffic.
- **Stay on the trail, the land on either side is private property.** Landowners along the route were kind enough to donate easements to the Town for the trail – but on the condition that trail users stay on the trail.
- **Please leash and pick-up after your dog.**
- **Please enjoy the trail but stay safe - don't travel alone.**
- **Town Parks and Trails are open dawn to dusk.**
- **Smoking and alcoholic beverages are prohibited in Town Parks and Trails**
- If you see any maintenance or illegal use issues please help maintain the trail by reporting them to Town Supervisor Pete Glushko at 726-6233.
